Capability and capacity building

Helen supported local groups with practical, tailored advice to help them grow and thrive. Here's what was included:

- Personalised 1-2-1 support
- Guidance on governance roles, responsibilities, and decision making
- Help with compliance meeting legal and regulatory requirements
- Support with funding strategy reviewing plans and grant scheme eligibility
- Advice on legal structures including setup, restructuring, and conversions
- Tailored follow-up report with clear, practical recommendations
- Support to put recommendations into practice such as reviewing draft policies or action plans
