## Welcome to NCVS150

We're excited to have you join us in celebrating 150 years of strengthening communities in Nottingham!

Since 1875, we've been at the heart of Nottingham's voluntary sector—supporting organisations, empowering volunteers, and championing community action. Our NCVS150 celebrations honour this rich history while looking ahead to a future where local people and voluntary organisations continue to thrive.

#### Why NCVS150 matters

For a century and a half, NCVS has been a driving force behind positive social change. This year, we're celebrating the stories, people, and partnerships that have shaped our city—and we want you to be part of it.

By working together, we can:

- Recognise the past Sharing the history and impact of voluntary action in Nottingham.
- Support the present Championing the vital work happening right now.

In the 1800s, life in Nottingham was tough—overcrowding, poor sanitation, limited education, and poverty shaped daily life. Support was available, but often unorganised:

- Workhouses offered basic shelter but came with harsh conditions and social stigma.
- Charities provided food and financial aid, though without coordination.
- Churches gave alms, education, and a sense of community.
- Mutual aid societies pooled resources, fostering community-driven support. Despite these efforts, many still struggled. In response, Nottingham's voluntary sector began to take shape.

#### The birth of NCVS

In December 1875, Henrietta Carey founded the Nottingham Society for Organising Charity (NSOC) to bring order to local charitable work. Partnering with the Poor Law Authorities, NSOC aimed to improve lives and reduce dependence on workhouses. Their first case was recorded in March 1876—the beginning of a legacy of community support.

#### From NSOC to NCVS

By 2010, NSOC had evolved into the Nottingham Community and Voluntary Service (NCVS), expanding its focus to strengthen and support the entire voluntary sector.

### **NCVS Today**

For 150 years, NCVS has empowered Nottingham's voluntary organisations through training, resources, and partnerships. We remain dedicated to building a stronger, more connected community—one where people and organisations thrive.

Our goal is to engage the community, honour NCVS's history, and inspire future volunteerism and community involvement.


# Using the NCVS150 brand

Our brand is a reflection of our 150 years of history, strength, and commitment to Nottingham's voluntary sector. To ensure consistency and maintain a professional, cohesive image across all materials, we've provided a set of brand assets, along with guidelines for how to use them.

Please follow these guidelines to help represent the NCVS150 celebrations in a way that aligns with our identity.

## Logos

To celebrate turning 150 we've jazzed up our original logo and now have three new logo designs to suit various needs, and represent our birthday. You can download the logos by clicking on the links below. Once the image opens, right-click and choose 'Save image as' to save it to your device. Pick the version that best fits your materials.



<u>Full colour with white background</u>: Best for digital or printed materials where a clean, bold look is desired.

<u>Full colour with no background</u>: Perfect for use over imagery or when you need a more flexible, adaptable logo.

<u>Semi-whiteout with no background</u>: Ideal for dark or textured backgrounds, offering a subtle yet recognisable option.

## **Co-branding guidelines**

- Spacing: Leave enough space around both logos to keep things neat and avoid any visual clutter.
- **No modifications**: Please don't change the logos in any way—no resizing, recolouring, or adding effects.
